8th Grade Students Will Visit European Cities

Next May, our eighth grade students will be participating in an international trip to Europe. Ms. Nadia, an eighth grade parent, and Jeff will chaperone the trip to Vilnius, Lithuania and to Berlin, Germany. Their trip is packed with educational exploration which includes museums, culture, and learning to take care of oneself in a large city. In Vilnius, our students will see the UNESCO protected old town of Vilnius, the Jewish ghetto from World War II, and the Extermination Museum where both the Nazis and the Soviets tortured and murdered the local Lithuanian citizens. In Berlin, the students will visit a Nazi concentration camp, world-famous museums, the Berlin Wall, and the 1936 Olympic stadium, where track star Jesse Owens crushed Hitler's belief that the German Aryans would be the supreme athletes. Leading up to this trip, our eighth grade students will study World War II, the Holocaust, the Cold War, and the fall of communism in East Germany and in Lithuania.





To help defray the costs of this trip, our students have taken on fundraising efforts, initiating the events themselves. Yesterday, they spent the day at the Multipurpose Center in Susupe, selling handpainted glass Christmas ornaments for \$12 each. They still have extras that can be purchased. If you are interested, see Ms. JoAnn or Jeff for help. We are very proud of the responsible attitude displayed by our eighth grade students and hope that you will support their efforts.
